Obtaining a high school diploma is one of the crucial first steps in finding gainful employment. This program is a sure route to career development. Students receive instruction in each of the five (5) subject areas of the GED exam: Language Arts - Reading, Language Arts, Writing, Science, Social Studies, and Mathematics. Students take simulated tests, which are corrected and analyzed to determine strengths and weaknesses. The Literacy Lab is equipped with computers and interactive literacy and GED Test Prep software.

GED preparation is available for adults 16 years or older who are not in the school system. Students must score a 9.0 grade level or above on the TABE test. Students who score below are entered into pre-GED
